He grabbed it and tried to paddle his way, along with his own kids, closer to mine that had now floated out of sight.

Meanwhile, Brandon and I were so close to the west side (the wrong side) of the river that we ended up going to shore there. We had bare feet and by this point in time I realized that my phone and wallet were now missing. They had floated down the river!!!

We walked the west side of the river for a long time, caking red sand, thorns and brambles into our feet, attempting to find different areas to cross back. But ultimately, my son panicked at each crossing location and we went back to the west, wrong, side of the river. Literally hours passed, and we finally came to a bouldered crossing that gave us the footing Brandon needed to feel safe enough to cross. We crossed and then walked down the side of the road until finally our van, with my friend driving and the kids safely in the passenger seats, came and picked us up. I was crazy frazzled and just wanted to get home.
